#### The Birth of Jesus Foretold

<sup>26</sup> In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, <sup>27</sup>to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. <sup>28</sup>And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you.' <sup>29</sup>But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. <sup>30</sup>The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. <sup>31</sup>And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. <sup>32</sup>He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. <sup>33</sup>He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.' <sup>34</sup>Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' <sup>35</sup>The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. <sup>36</sup>And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. <sup>37</sup>For nothing will be impossible with God.' <sup>38</sup>Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her.

## St. George's Crib service - 3pm - Christmas Eve

Are you planning on coming to the Crib service? We are going to hold this; but it needs to be Covid-safe, to protect all of us, our families, and those who are vulnerable.

The first step is that this is an outdoor service; we therefore have plenty of fresh air and plenty of space at the top of the Green. Even though it is outdoors we will still be following the "Hands. Face. Space" mantra:

- Please hand sanitise before you arrive (and as you think necessary)
- Wear a face covering at all times. (We are allowed to sing outdoors, but wearing a face covering minimises the risk of transmission even more.)
- 2m spacing Respect the distance to other social bubbles at all times

The latter is tricky because this is essentially a service for the children. To minimise the children moving around they need to be able to see what is going on. The nativity story characters are gathering at the lych-gate – which is becoming "the stable"; it would be better if adults were sitting down so that children can stand and see. So, if you can bring garden chairs that will help please. (Sitting down also reduces the tendency to "move forward for a better view"!)

The road at the top of the Green will be coned off; please stay on the grass or on the road either side of the Green.

There will be a carol service sheet available for the service; we do not want these back! Please take them home with you at the end of the service. The service is expected to last 35/40mins; please disperse and head home straight away. There will be buckets for a "retiring collection". (We also have a contactless card-payment system which you are welcome to use.)

So, for a Covid-safe Crib Service for us all, remember:

"Hands. Face. Space." And no mixing of social bubbles.

Comfort and Joy is the Church of England's Christmas campaign for 2020.

It holds together the hope that Christmas will bring joy and celebration after a uniquely difficult year with an acknowledgement that – for those who have lost loved ones or livelihoods, or who are potentially still not able to be together with loved ones – it may be the Church's role, both nationally and locally, to provide consolation, rather than assume everyone will be ready to join in jubilation.

We also have to anticipate there may be further spikes.

This Christmas the Church will need, in the words of St Paul in Romans 12.15, to 'Rejoice with those who rejoice; weep with those who weep'. We will aim to celebrate where we can together in one place – but also embrace a wider community that wants to join in the celebration but may not be physically able – or emotionally ready – to do so. We hope that Comfort and Joy will enable us to build a campaign that both enables us to reconnect with the rich and joyous traditions of the past and to offer God's consoling love in the present.

#### Sunday 27th December:

With all the busyness of this extraordinary year, we have decided, in line with guidance from our Bishop this week, not to hold any services in the parish on the 27<sup>th</sup> December. The statement from the Diocese reads, "In the interest of people being able to take a proper break after Christmas, Bishop Rose is encouraging those involved in church leadership not to feel under any pressure to hold live church services (either online or in person) on Sunday 27 December."

The thinking behind this is to give all involved in the services that day in both parishes (sidespeople; organists; choirs; readers; intercessors; those preparing and leading worship and those preparing sermons) time off with their families during the "Christmas Covid window" from the 23rd and 27th December. It's not just about the time on the Sunday, it also frees people up from the preparation time. Reading in the Church Times: the Diocese of Ely have already formally implemented this across their Diocese.

I trust that everyone will understand this decision, and allow those who have worked so hard for us all in the unprecedented times to have a rest with their families.
